



2002 Meyer Family Syrah Mendocino County Technical Sheet



Tasting Notes

Accessed from a well-situated vineyard in northern Sonoma County, the 2002 Syrah exhibits the complex aromatic and flavor characteristics of this great variety. On the nose, elegant aromas of violets and dried rose petals mingle with blue and blackberries, underscored by hints of white pepper and Syrah's signature earthiness. Rich and juicy on the palate, the wine's primary fruit flavors of blueberry and cherry are framed by soft, integrated grape and wood tannins, balanced by a bright acidity. Moderate alcohol makes this medium-bodied red wine a delicious pairing with a range of flavorful cuisines. The 2002 Syrah is a complex, food-friendly wine that leaves a lasting impression on the palate.
